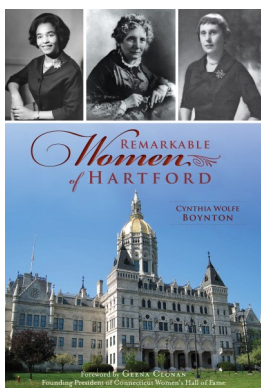

## COMMUNITY COLLECTIONS OUTREACH PROJECT

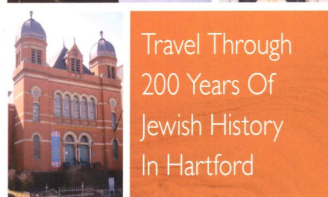

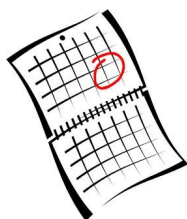

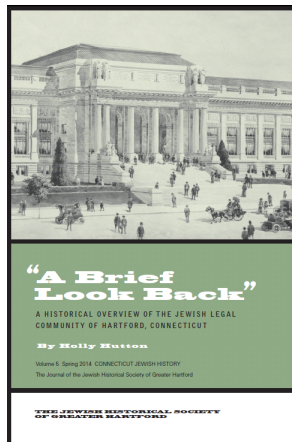

## “A Brief Look Back”



On May 14th, the Society hosted a reception to introduce its newest journal, *A Brief Look Back: A Historical Overview of the Jewish Legal Community of Hartford, Connecticut*. The evening included a cocktail hour, a light buffet dinner and brief remarks by the Honorable David Borden, the Honorable Susan Peck, and the Honorable George Levine. Emcee, attorney Daniel Klau also provided a musical interlude. We are grateful to the members of our advisory committee, and our volunteers, who helped to make this evening such a success.

*A Brief Look Back*, written by Holly Hutton, provides a historical overview of Hartford's Jewish legal profession and professionals, from the late 1800s to the present day. There are also essays by current lawyers and judges, along with photos and transcript excerpts from past interviews in the Society's archives. This volume documents the long-standing anti-Semitism in the field, along with the changing climate that has led to the current level of acceptance at major law firms. ## JHSGH 2014 ANNUAL MEETING

This year's Annual Meeting provided an opportunity to recap a very successful year for the Society. In brief remarks, Executive Director, Estelle Kafer, President Louise Kaufman and other officers reported on the trips, programs and fundraising activities of the Society.

The focus of the evening was the panel discussion on the Hartford circus fire, on its 70th anniversary. There were five panelists who dealt with various aspects of the tragedy. The Hon. Henry Cohn, author of *The Great Circus Fire: Creative Settlement of Mass Disasters*, detailed the way in which litigation and restitution were handled following the tragedy, and how new law was created in light of the unique circumstances. Brenda Miller, Executive Director of the Hartford History Center spoke about the Center's Circus Fire Scrapbook Project. Michael R. Skidgell, author of *The Hartford Circus Fire: Tragedy Under the Big Top* shared many historical photos and other items from that day. Chief Charles Teale, the former Chief of the Hartford Fire Department talked about the fire itself, how it started and grew, who started it, and the consequences, both for the victims and for the first responders. Author Laura Woollett, who wrote the young adult book, *Big Top Burning! The Story of an Arsonist, A Missing Girl and the Greatest Show on Earth* (to be published spring 2015), described why she thought it was important to share this story with middle-school students.

Following the panel presentation, members of the audience shared their own stories, which were very moving. Several had been in the tent that day and recalled how they were able to escape, while others told of losing friends and family members in the fire. We are grateful to our presenters and all those who shared their memories.

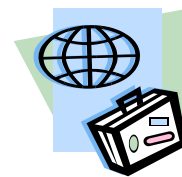

## **HOLOCAUST SURVIVOR INTERVIEW PROJECT**

As Holocaust survivors age, it is even more vital for us to preserve their stories for future generations. These voices must never be stilled, so that they can continue to testify to the horrors of the Shoah, and bear witness to this time of man's inhumanity to man, as well as the continued need for hope.

For this reason, members of Voices of Hope, the children and grandchildren of Holocaust survivors have contacted the Society in order to jointly coordinate an oral history project, designed to capture the faces, voices and memories of Holocaust survivors in our area. The Society provides training in how to conduct an interview and will work with Voices of Hope to identify individuals to be interviewed. If you know of a Holocaust survivor living in the Greater Hartford area, please contact the Society with his/her name and contact information. Even if that individual has been interviewed by another organization, it's important that we have an oral history available in our community, for use by local students, educators, and researchers.
