



*We Were the Lucky Ones* comes from the experiences of Georgia Hunter's grandfather — Addy in the book — and his family. In high school, Hunter interviewed her grandmother for a research project, and came away with a remarkable story that lives within her own family. This story never strayed from her mind, and in 2008 she began searching for the rest, traveling to Poland, France, and beyond. Seven years later her novel was complete. This is the story of a Jewish family in Radom ripped away from each other at the start of the war, and their struggle to survive and make it back to one another. Of the 30,000 Jews who lived in Poland at the start of World War II, fewer than 300 survived.

# From the Director

Dear Friends,

It was wonderful to see many of you at our fabulous 45<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Gala last October. I appreciate your generosity and support of this important and successful fundraiser.

When our new publication *Jewish Community of Hartford* by Arcadia Press came our last September, I was pleased to receive a number of invitations from synagogues and various institutions to speak about the volume. People have enjoyed looking at the over 200 historical photos, which have triggered pleasant memories and favorite stories. Books are available on our website or in the office.

As you read through these pages, you will notice the numerous programs and events we are sponsoring and co-sponsoring this spring. We also have been busy with two exciting oral history projects. The “Family History on the Road” project is working with synagogue and day school educators to train 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> grade students how to conduct an oral history interview with a family member. We are providing workshops, a detailed handbook, and ongoing support to guide teachers, parents, and students through the process. The second is the Community Leadership Oral History Project, in which two professional consultants are initially conducting interviews of Greater Hartford’s religious leadership. They will follow with interviews of professional and lay leadership. Each project will bring valuable community connections and recognition, and raise awareness about the Society and the important role we play in remembering the past, preserving the present, and building for the future.

We are very grateful to the Jewish Community Foundation and the Jeffrey Hoffman Family fund for making these vital projects possible.

## From the Archivist

Dear Friends,

We have had some exciting new additions to our collection the past few months. Brooksie Koopman sent us records from the Fifteen Club of Congregation Beth Israel, which included minutes of meetings, organizational history, and programs from luncheons hosted by the organization. These materials give fascinating insight into an organization from our past and filled in some of the gaps of our collection. Hebrew Health Care donated several ledgers recording donations to the Hebrew Home (all written out by hand!) as well as photo albums. Charlotte Berman brought in materials about “The Magen David Show” a Jewish radio program in which she participated. Barbara Snyder gave us a large photo of the Glazier family at the 50th Anniversary party of Lillian & Sol Hurwitz, and Barbara Nair donated a variety of papers relating to local organizations.

On January 26<sup>th</sup>, the Society acted as a host site for a crowdsourcing effort in Connecticut to contribute to the *History Unfolded* project of the U. S. Holocaust Museum, which aims to create a database of American newspaper coverage of the Holocaust. About thirty specific events have been selected to guide researchers’ searching. Four volunteers came to our office and identified over 25 articles on three different events using newspapers in our collection, and I am in the process of uploading this information to the national database.
